BIG PICTURE CHECKLIST

- ✓ **The student-athlete, NOT the parent(s) needs to lead this charge**, especially with direct contact with college coaches; they do NOT want to deal with the “Agent Parent”
- ✓ **Grades** (bare bones Core GPA: 2.3/D1 & 2.2/D2)
- ✓ **Register** with NCAA Eligibility Center
- ✓ Track **CORE COURSES** with Counselor at DRHS
- ✓ Research colleges at ALL levels (there are **674** NCAA football programs!)
- ✓ Complete each school’s **online recruiting questionnaire!**
- ✓ **Prepare materials** to send to coaches
 - ✓ Hudl highlights
 - ✓ “Infographic”/Player Resume
 - ✓ Be sure ALL **online bios** are 1) CONSISTENT, 2) ACCURATE, 3) UPDATED
- ✓ **Email Coaches** with all relevant info and links to highlights
 - ✓ 100 minimum; narrow to a 10-10-10, then 5-5-5 list
 - ✓ Be persistent, but not a pest
 - ✓ Follow Up & reply to all messages
 - ✓ Update on progress, milestones, etc., as relevant/meaningful
- ✓ Schedule **Unofficial** campus visits
- ✓ Attend on-campus **Prospect Camps** of target schools
- ✓ **Keep Coach Woj in the loop** on all contacts from schools and all school visits

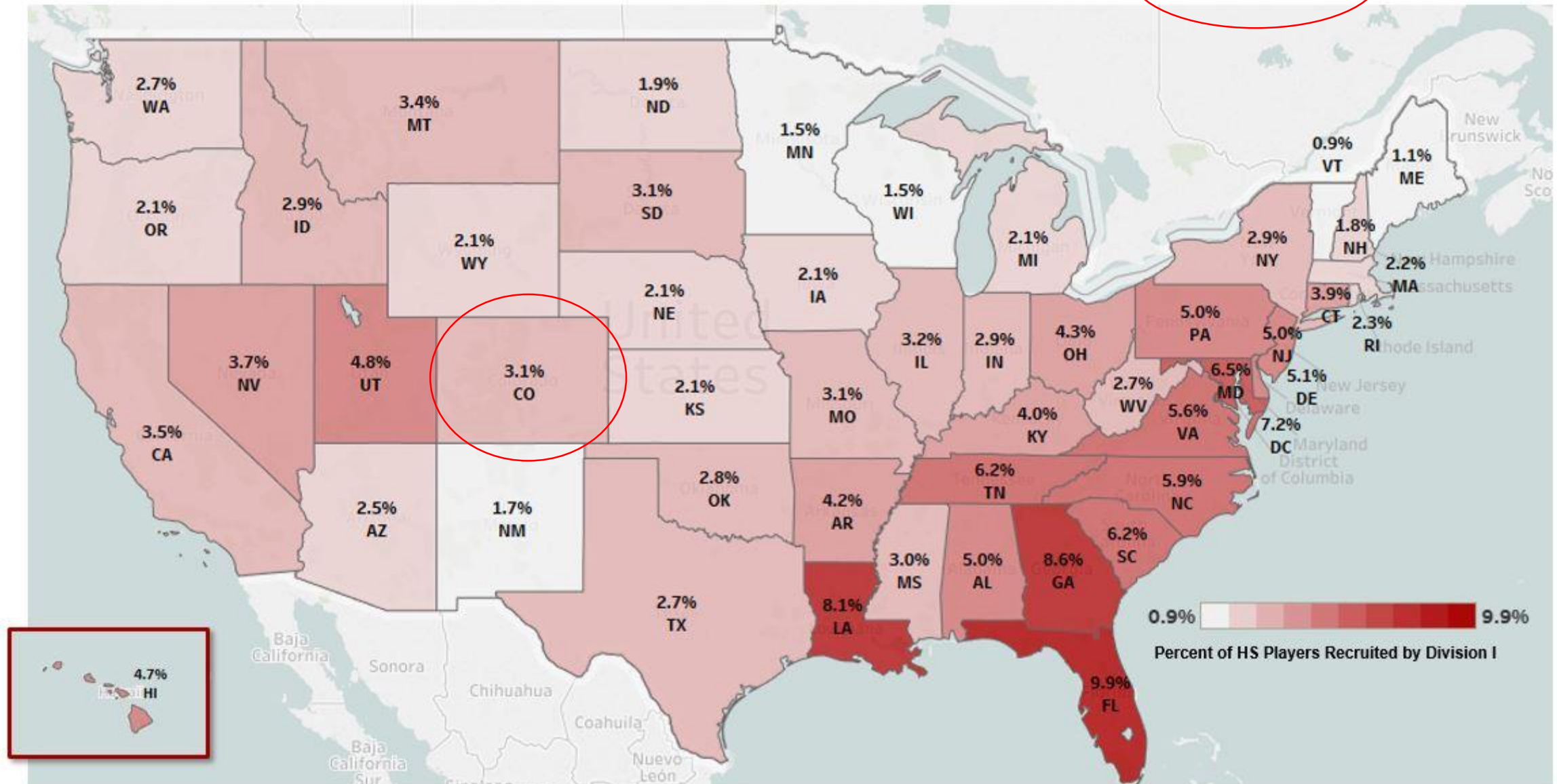

Freshman Year HS

- Develop GREAT STUDY habits and a HOMEWORK ROUTINE
- Recognize where you need to spend additional time...and do it
- Enjoy Football!
 - Go 100% every play; impress your coaches and your teammates with your WORK ETHIC
 - LEARN and UNDERSTAND your position, assignments, etc.
 - Go to Varsity Games
- Play other sports
- Build a BASE GPA...start strong and get stronger!



Sophomore Year HS

- Start to look at schools that interest YOU
- Evaluate your GPA → Where do you stand?
- Look at NCAA Resources & Requirements
 - NCAA Eligibility Center Registration (MANDATORY)
 - NAIA Eligibility Center Registration
 - Junior College Programs
- Consider College “Prospect” Camps
 - School-hosted
 - Private (FBU, Nike Elite, Etc)
- Consider taking UNOFFICIAL visits to schools
 - Be “ready”... Grades matter at this point



UNOFFICIAL vs OFFICIAL VISITS

- **OFFICIAL VISITS**

- Invite-only
 - April 1 – Last Wednesday in June of your Junior year
 - All expenses paid by school for player & parents
 - Travel, Room, Meals, Tix, Entertainment

- **UNOFFICIAL VISITS**

- Can do “almost” anytime (not during “dead” periods)
- Arrange through the football office
- They can provide up to 3 game tix if a game-day visit
- You pay all other expenses (*ask if there are places to stay on campus, discounts sometimes apply*)

- Be direct when talking to the coach.

“Coach, I am in the process of scheduling my unofficial visits and would like to visit your university. Would you be available to meet with me next Saturday or Sunday? And, is there anything you need me to get to you ahead of time?”

Keep it simple, and make it your goal to pin down a meeting time with the coach, and not “sure, just stop by”. (This is important)

- Best time is spring/summer and fall game weekends

Junior Year HS

- Learn recruiting calendars – NCAA
 - **OFFICIAL VISITS CAN START APRIL 1 – LAST WEDNESDAY IN JUNE OF YOUR JUNIOR YEAR**
 - **Official visit** = all expenses paid by school for player & parents
- Consider “Unofficial” Campus visits
 - Arrange through the school; they can provide up to 3 game tickets
- Know where you are Academically
 - Consider ACT/SAT Prep Course before you take the actual test
- Start to create a Recruiting Profile
- Interact with Coaches at REALISTIC TARGET SCHOOLS
- **Attend “Prospect Camps”**
 - School-hosted

Senior Year HS

- Know where you are Academically → Last chance
 - Consider ACT/SAT Prep Course well before you take the actual test
- Review both H.S. and NCAA Eligibility
- Official & Unofficial visits
- Narrow choices to a REALISTIC list of schools
- Recognize where you fit in (FBS? FCS? D2? D3?; Full Ride? Partial? Walk-on?)
 - **If no D1 offers by now**, it is HIGHLY unlikely they will com; change your focus
- 10-14 games left in your high school CAREER...put great film out there every single play; share with realistic target schools
- GO OUT STRONG...there are no do-overs.
- **You really have the fall semester only; don't wait!**

During contact periods college coaches can call unlimited.

Official Visits

You can start official visits on the opening day of your classes.

You get one per college and a maximum of **5 visits to D1 schools and unlimited to D2, D3 and NAIA.**

NCAA “CORE COURSES”

Classes that are NCAA core courses include:

- English: **English 1-4**, American Literature, creative writing
- Math: **Algebra 1-3, Geometry**, statistics
- Natural of physical science: **biology, chemistry, physics**
- Social science: American **History, civics, government**
- Additional: comparative religion, **Spanish 1-4**

Classes that are not NCAA core courses include:

- Classes in non-core areas, fine arts or vocations such as driver education, typing, **art, music, physical education** or welding.
- Personal skill classes such as personal finance or consumer education.
- Classes taught below grade level, at a slower pace or with less rigor or depth. These classes are often titled basic, essential, fundamental or foundational.
- Classes that are not academic in nature such as film appreciation, video editing or greenhouse management.

DO: **Identify yourself** ...an arrow or a circle here is good.

"DON'T BURY THE LEAD" ...

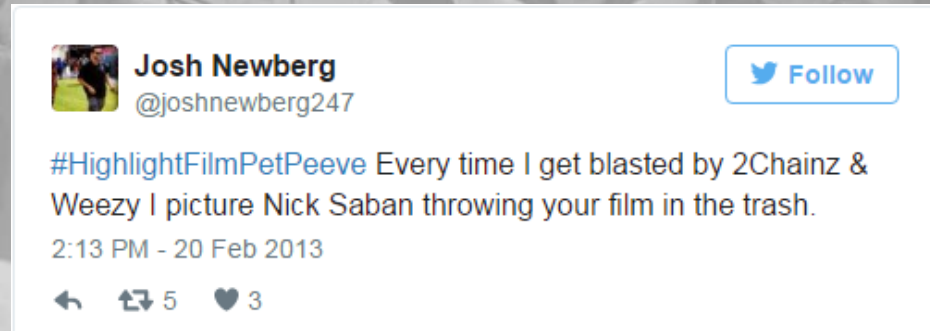
DO: Lead with your best plays.

DON'T: Mess with the speed of the film. Using slow motion or fast forward isn't fooling anyone, and it doesn't make the highlight easier to evaluate.

DON'T: Use celebratory graphics, like old school Batman style "BOOM" or "POW".

DON'T: Use music. Let your play on the field do the singing for you, and the coach watching it will be doing the dancing!

DON'T: Make your highlight private. This is one of the worst and it is happening more frequently.

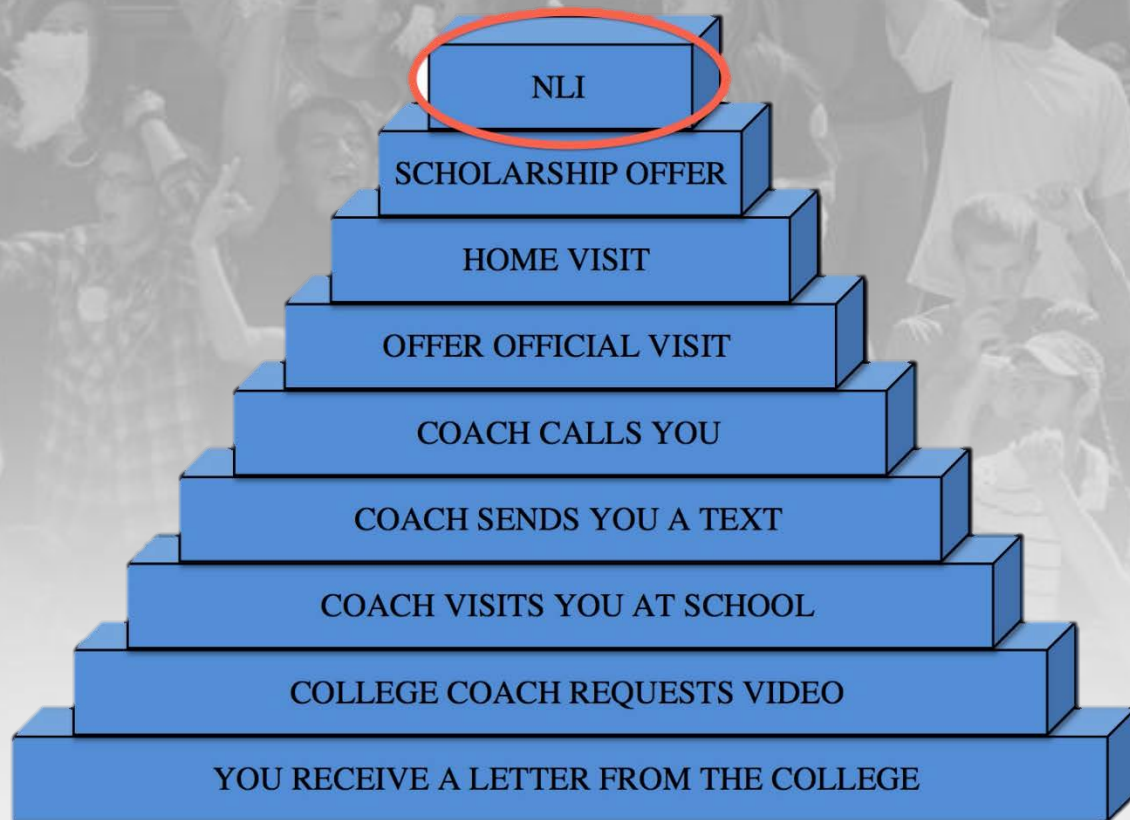

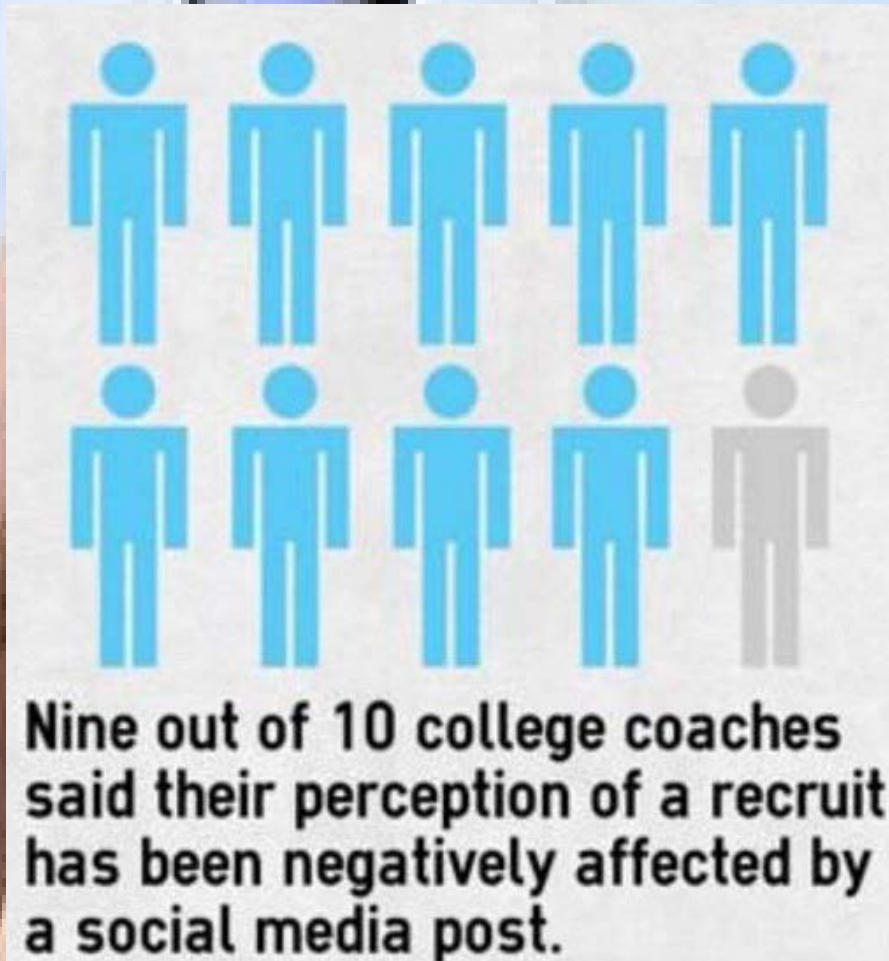

- ✓ **Register** with NCAA Eligibility Center
- ✓ Track **CORE COURSES** with Counselor at DRHS
- ✓ Research colleges at ALL levels (there are **674** NCAA football programs!)
- ✓ Complete each school’s **online recruiting questionnaire!**
- ✓ **Prepare materials** to send to coaches
 - ✓ Hudl highlights
 - ✓ “Infographic”/Player Resume
 - ✓ Be sure ALL **online bios** are 1) CONSISTENT, 2) ACCURATE, 3) UPDATED
- ✓ **Email Coaches** with all relevant info and links to highlights
 - ✓ 100 minimum; narrow to a 10-10-10, then 5-5-5 list
 - ✓ Be persistent, but not a pest
 - ✓ Follow Up & reply to all messages
 - ✓ Update on progress, milestones, etc., as relevant/meaningful
- ✓ Schedule **Unofficial** campus visits
- ✓ Attend on-campus **Prospect Camps** of target schools
- ✓ **Keep Coach Woj in the loop** on all contacts from schools and all school visits
