



T-Ball Rules

- No new inning after 1 hour from start of game
- All players bat every inning. Batting order is to be maintained, but no penalty for batting out of order.
- Baserunners may continue to advance the bases until the defensive team controls the ball anywhere on the field. If between bases when the ball is controlled the baserunner may continue to advance to the next base at their own peril of being put out.
 - For the final batter of the inning, all baserunners may advance home regardless of defensive control of the ball.
- When the defensive team makes an out on the field, the player called out is removed from the bases, however the out is not recorded. (Meaning, if by some miracle 3 outs are made in the inning, the offensive team continues to bat through their lineup)
- Any disagreements on out/safe calls shall be ruled safe
- Obstruction and Interference rules are not enforced
- Players may not play consecutive innings in the outfield
- Players may not play the same position more than 1 inning per game
- If a player arrives to the game after it has begun, that player may be inserted anywhere in the batting order and defensive lineup
- If a player has to leave the game before it has ended, that player's spot in the batting order is simply skipped without penalty.
- In any game where FWNLL team is playing at another league. The home team's league rules shall be applied. Ensure you speak with the opposing coach BEFORE you arrive at the game field to determine rules.
- Offensive and Defensive teams may use as many coaches on the field and in the dugout(bench) as they deem necessary. No adults are permitted on the field or in the dugout (bench) without current Volunteer Application on file. Older siblings (10 and up) are permitted on the field without volunteer application, but must wear a batting helmet. An Adult coach must always be in the dugout(Bench).
- Any rules not specifically addressed here shall be enforced by the Little League BASEBALL Rulebook.

T-Ball is a developmental league. Both teams' primary goal is to develop a love of the game for all players and families involved, regardless of the jersey they wear. Failure to adhere to this philosophy can result in removal.
